An Act to amend chapter thirty of the Revised Statutes.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Amendment.

Section 1. The second section of chapter thirty (30) of the revised statutes is hereby so amended as to read: "It shall not be lawful for any person to sell, give away, or dispose of or keep for such purpose, any intoxicating liquors, at any place upon lands belonging to or occupied under treaty stipulations with the United States by any nation or tribe of Indians within this state, and any Indian superintendent or agent shall have and is hereby given the authority to seize and destroy any liquor kept for such purpose within the said limits, without any other or further warrant therefor.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its pas-

sage.

CHAPTER 90.

An Act to amend [to amend] section twenty-two of chapter sixteen, of the Revised Statutes.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Amendment

SECTION 1. Every male inhabitant in each road district, being over the age of twenty—one years, and under the age of fifty years, excepting persons of color, paupers, idiots, and lunatics, shall be assessed to pay a poll tax of one dollar, said tax may be paid to the overseer in cash, or be commuted for in labor, as now provided by law.
