AN ACT to change and fix the time for holding the Circuit Courts in the several counties within the fourth Judicial Circuit.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

§ 1. The terms of the Circuit Court shall be holden in the counties of Winnebago, Fond du Lac, Manitowoc, Sheboygan, and Calumet, the counties comprising the (4th) Fourth Judicial Circuit, at the times following, in each year: In the county of Winnebago, on the first Monday of May, eighteen hundred and fifty-seven, and thereafter, on the second Monday of September and the second Monday of March in each year; in the county of Fond du Lac on the fourth Monday of March and the fourth Monday of September; in the county of Sheboygan, on the second Monday of April, and the second Monday in October; in the county of Manitowoc on the fourth (4th) Monday of April and October; in the county of Calumet on the second Monday in May, and first Monday in November.

§ 2. All Writs, Summons, Indictments, Recognizances and other proceedings made returnable by any law of this State now in force to the terms of the several Circuit Courts mentioned in this act, shall be returnable to the terms of said Circuit Courts as the same are hereinbefore fixed, and all adjournments, appearances, continuances, motions and notices of any proceedings in said Court, made or taken to any term of a previous or subsequent date to the term when this act shall take effect, shall be held to be made and taken for the time hereinbefore fixed for holding the terms of said Court.

§ 3. Chapter sixty-five of the session laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-five, approved March 31, 1855, is hereby repealed.

§ 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
