

**Chap. 75.**

Published May 6, 1857.

AN ACT to punish the crime of larceny on conviction for a second offence.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

Punishment for Larceny, second offence.

§ 1. Every person who shall commit the crime of larceny, by stealing of the property of another, any money, goods or chattels, or any bank note, bond, promissory note, bill of exchange or other bill or certificate or any book of accounts or concerning money or goods due or to become due or to be delivered or any deed or writing containing a conveyance of land or any other alienable contract in force, or any receipt, release or defeasance, or any writ, process or public record of the property stolen shall exceed the value of one hundred dollars, shall be punished by imprisonment in the State Prison, not more than three years, nor less than one year, and if the property stolen shall not exceed the value of one hundred dollars and exceeding twenty dollars, he shall be punished by imprisonment in the State Prison, not exceeding one year, nor less than six months, or by imprisonment in the county jail not more than one year, nor less than three months, or by fine not exceeding three hundred dollars.

**Chap. 76.**

AN ACT to authorize J. L. Jenks, administrator of the estate of the late James G. Percival, to draw the balance of salary due said estate.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

§ 1. The Secretary of State is hereby authorized to audit the claim of J. L. Jenks, administrator on the

estate of the late James G. Percival, to the amount of sixteen hundred and thirty five dollars, being the balance due said Percival for services as State Geologist.

§ 2. The State Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay to said J. L. Jenks, administrator as aforesaid, the sum of sixteen hundred and thirty-five dollars in accordance with the provisions of an act entitled "an act providing for the Geological survey of the State," approved March 25, 1853.

§ 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## Chap. 77.

Published May 7, 1857.

AN ACT to appropriate to Edward McGarry, State Prison Commissioner, the sum of money therein named.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

§ 1. There is hereby appropriated to Edward McGarry, State Prison Commissioner, out of any money in the State Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of thirty-seven thousand and two hundred dollars as follows: twenty-two thousand dollars to defray the current expenses of the State Prison for the year 1857; twelve thousand dollars to be applied to the completion of the main building of the prison; three thousand dollars for laying the foundation of a wall around the Prison grounds, and two hundred dollars for the purchase of books for the use of the convicts.

§ 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
