AN ACT to regulate the fees of Clerks of Circuit Courts.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

§ 1. The fees of Clerks of Circuit Courts for any services herein specified to be rendered by them, shall be as follows:

For docketing cause, first time, fifty cents; for filing each paper, ten cents; for drawing jury, in each cause, fifty cents; for docketing each judgment, one dollar; for entering transcript of Justices judgment, and satisfying same, one dollar; for per diem, during session of any court, to be paid out of the county treasury, on the certificate of the judge, three dollars.

§ 2. All acts and parts of acts contravening the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

AN ACT to amend chapter ninety-four of the Session Laws of 1853.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

§ 1. No town in any County in the State with an area of thirty-six sections or less according to the United States survey shall be divided or have any part stricken therefrom without submitting the question to a vote of the legal voters of the town.

§ 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage
