SEC. 2. The Treasurer of the county of Columbia is hereby authorized and required to apportion to the town of West Point, the sum of forty-eight dollars and thirty cents in addition to the regular apportionment of said town for the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight.

SEC. 3. The Treasurer of the county of Dane is hereby authorized and required to apportion to the town of Pleasant Spring, the sum of three hundred and twenty-one dollars and forty-two cents, in addition to the regular apportionment to said town for the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight.

To towns of
Albion, Alma,
Bristol, Irving
and Manches-
ter.

SEC. 4. The Treasurer of the county of Jackson is hereby authorized and required to apportion to the town of Albion, the sum of one hundred and fifty-two dollars and forty-six cents; to the town of Alma, the sum of sixty-two dollars and seventy cents; to the town of Bristol, the sum of forty-two dollars and twenty-four cents; to the town of Irving, the sum of fifty-two dollars and fourteen cents; and to the town of Manchester the sum of seventy dollars and forty-six cents, in addition to the regular apportionment to said towns for the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

AN ACT to provide for the payment of the Clerk of the Revisors.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

To audit ac-
count of Clerk
of Revisors.

SECTION 1. The Secretary of State is hereby directed and authorized to audit the account of James M. Flowers, against the State, for services rendered as a Clerk of the Revisors, upon the certificate of the said Revisors, or a majority of them, stating the number of days

of actual service rendered by him; he shall draw a warrant upon the State Treasurer for the amount so audited, and a sufficient sum of money is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to pay the same. The per diem pay of the said clerk shall be the same as that allowed to enrolling and transcribing clerks of the present legislature. Per diem.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Chapter 26.

AN ACT to provide for the payment of the Clerks of the Joint Committee of the Judiciary and Claims.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, a sum sufficient to pay for the services of the Clerks of the Joint Committee of Claims and on the Judiciary; *Provided*, The per diem pay of such Clerks shall be three dollars; *Provided further*, That the Clerk of the Joint Judiciary Committee shall receive no pay as such Clerk while acting as Clerk for the Revisors, and drawing pay therefor. Appropriated to Clerks.
Provisos.

SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the chairman of each of said committees, to certify to the services rendered and the amount due for such services; and upon presentation of such certificate, the Secretary of State shall issue to the holder thereof, a warrant upon the Treasurer for the amount so certified, and the Treasurer shall pay the same. Chairman to certify to services.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
