AN ACT to amend section twenty-eight, of chapter one hundred and thirty-two, of the Revised Statutes, entitled "Of issues, mode of trial and judgments in civil actions."

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section twenty-eight, of chapter one hun-Amendment dred and thirty-two, of the Revised Statutes, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following words: "or the judge, in his discretion, instead of giving judgment thereon, may make an order striking out such demurrer, answer or reply, and allow the party interposing the same further time to plead, upon such terms as he shall deem just. If no further pleading is served within the further time so given, the opposite party may proceed in the cause as for want of such pleading, and take such further order or judgment as he may be entitled to for want thereof."

SEC. 2. This act shall be published immediately, and shall take effect from its passage and publication.
