## CHAPTER 142.

[Published Murch 30, 1860.]

AN ACT to enthorize the Secretary of State to credit certain money to the county of Green Lake.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Duty of Sec. Shorton 1. The Secretary of State is hereby authorized and directed to credit the county of Green Lake, upon her State tax for the year 1859, the sum of one hundred and fifty-five dollars and sixty cents; being their proportion of the penalty charged against the county of Marquette, on her delinquent State tax for the year 1858, and collected and paid by the county of Green Lake, in the year 1859, and passed to the credit of the said county of Marquette.

Further duty. Sec. 2. The amount of one hundred and fifty-five dollars and sixty cents, so credited as above directed to the county of Green Lake, shall be charged by the Secretary of State to the county of Marquette.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 143.

[Published March 30, 1860.]

AN ACT to define the boundary line between the counties of Green Lake and Marquette.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Bounderies. defined. SECTION 1. The boundary line between the countries of Green Lake and Marquette, is hereby defined to be as follows: commencing at the north-cast corner of section three, of town 17 north, of range 11 east, and running thence south to the north line of town 16, range 11 east, to the north-east corner of section 3, in said last mentioned town, thence west along the line between towns 16 and 17, to the half section corner of section four, in town 16 north, of range 11 east, thence south to
