

## CHAPTER 161.

[Published March 27, 1860.]

AN ACT to amend sections one and two, of chapter eighty-nine, of the General Laws of 1859, entitled "An act to prevent unauthorized purchases in behalf of the State."

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section one, of chapter eighty-nine, of the General Laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-nine, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "stationery," in the third line from the end of said section, the following words: "and furniture." Furniture may be purchased.

SEC. 2. Section two, of the same chapter, is hereby amended by striking out all after the word "stationery," in the third line from the end of said section, and insert the following: "And provided further, that in case the expenses for furniture to be purchased, shall exceed the sum of one hundred dollars, then and in such case the said Superintendent of Public Property shall, to that end, receive at least three proposals for furnishing such furniture, and the contract shall be let to the lowest bidder." Shall contract

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 162.

[Published April 7, 1860.]

AN ACT to lay out a state road from Stevens Point to Eau Claire.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Burt Britt, John Weeks and J. S. Sherman, of the counties of Portage, Marathon and Eau Claire, are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a state road from the city of Stevens Point, Portage county, by the way of John Weeks' mill, to the village of Eau Claire, in the county of Eau Claire.
