## CHAPTER 242.

[Published March 30, 1860.]

AN ACT to vacate and extinguish the town of Orwell, in the county of Racine, and to attach the territory comprising the same to the towns of Mount Pleasant and Caledonia, in said county.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

Orwell extinguished.

SECTION 1. The corporation and body politic, known as the town of Orwell, in the county of Racine, is hereby vacated and extinguished, and shall hereafter have no existence as a body politic and corporate.

Territory annexed to Caledonia.

SEC. 2. All that territory in said town of Orwell, lying north of the line between township No. three and township No. four, is hereby annexed to, and shall hereafter form a part of the town of Caledonia, in said county; and all of that territory in said town of Orwell, which lies south of said line, between said townships No. three and four, is hereby annexed to, and shall hereafter constitute a part of the town of Mount Pleasant, in said county of Racine.

Territory annexed to Mt. Pleasant.

Where town records deposited.

SEC. 3. All of the books, records and papers of said town of Orwell, shall, immediately after the passage of this act, be deposited by the person or persons in whose custody the same may be, in the office of the clerk of the board of supervisors of said county of Racine, and said clerk shall be the custodian thereof.

County supervisor may be elected.

SEC. 4. There shall be elected, at each annual town meeting in said towns of Caledonia and Mount Pleasant, a county supervisor for said towns, who shall be entitled to a seat in the board of supervisors of Racine county. The votes for county supervisor shall be returned and canvassed in the same manner as votes given for members of the Assembly.

Votes returned and canvassed.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
