## CHAPTER 357.

AN ACT to amend chapter 277, of the Private and Local Laws of 1857, entitled "An act to incorporate the village of Waupun."

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows.

perintendent.

SECTION 1. That section seventeen, of said chapter Powers and dutwo hundred and seventy-seven, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following: "And such superintendent of schools shall have all the powers, exercise all the duties, and be subject to all the liabilities conferred, or imposed by law, upon superintendents of common schools, and reports shall be made to him by the school district board, of any district lying wholly or in part in said village of Waupun, in the same manner as is required by law to be made to town superintendents by school district boards."

Amendment.

§ 2. Section eighteen of said chapter is hereby amended by striking out all after the word "Waupun," where it occurs in the fourth line of said section.

Amendment

§ 3. Section twenty-two of said chapter is amended by striking out all after the words "school fund," where they occur in the fifth line of said section.

§ 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the first day of April, 1860.
