

## CHAPTER 44.

[Published February 28, 1861.]

AN ACT to extend the time for the collection of taxes in the city of Janesville.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. The time for the collection and return <sup>Time extended.</sup> of the state and county taxes in the city of Janesville, Rock county, is hereby extended until the twenty-eighth day of March, A. D. 1861, and the tax warrant now in the hands of the city treasurer, shall be in full force until the said twenty-eighth day of March, A. D. 1861, for all the purposes of collecting, levying distress and sale, and returning said taxes.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 45.

[Published February 28, 1861.]

AN ACT for the relief of the town of Eldorado, in the county of Fond du Lac.

*Whereas,* The books, papers and records of the town <sup>Preamble.</sup> of Eldorado have been destroyed by the burning of the office of the town clerk of said town, and the people thereof have been thus left destitute of any proper evidence of the existence of public highways, or the boundaries of school districts therein : therefore,

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. All roads heretofore surveyed and used <sup>Of roads.</sup> as public highways in said town of Eldorado (excepting such as may have been discontinued by the proper authorities) are hereby declared to be public highways.

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of the supervisors <sup>Of the re-survey of roads.</sup> of said town, and they are hereby required, as soon as

practicable, to cause to be made a re-survey of the highways referred to in the foregoing section of this act, and cause accurate descriptions thereof to be filed and recorded in the office of the town clerk of said town. Such descriptions, when so filed and recorded, shall be received as evidence in all courts and places whatsoever.

School districts  
to be re-described

SECTION 3. The town superintendent of schools of said town is hereby required to make out a new description of the territory embraced in the several school districts and parts of districts in said town, and cause the same to be filed and recorded in the office of the town clerk. Such descriptions when so filed and recorded, shall be received as evidence in all courts and places whatsoever.

Act to be pub-  
lished.

SECTION 4. The secretary of state shall cause a certified copy of this act to be published immediately, in some newspaper published in the county of Fond du Lac.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 46.

[Published February 28, 1861.]

AN ACT to amend Chapter 126 of the General Laws of 1858, entitled "Of School Laws and Law Library Associations."

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

"One hundred"  
in place of "twenty-five."

SECTION 1. Section three of chapter 126 of the general laws of 1858, is hereby amended by striking out the words "twenty-five" where they occur in said section, and inserting in lieu thereof the words "one hundred."

"One" in place  
of "ten."

SECTION 2. Section four of said act is hereby amended by striking out the word "ten" where it occurs in said section, and inserting in lieu thereof the word "one."

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
