

CHAPTER 6.

[Published January 25, 1861.]

AN ACT to legalize the official acts of David Y. Wethern, as Justice of the Peace in the county of Pierce.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That all the official acts and duties performed by David Y. Wethern, as justice of the peace, in the town of Diamond Bluff, in the county of Pierce, in this state, prior to the passage of this act, so far as the same are consistent with the general laws of this state, are hereby legalized and declared to be as valid for all purposes, as though the said David Y. Wethern had caused his official bond and oath to be made and filed in conformity with the statutes of this state.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 7.

[Published January 29, 1861.]

AN ACT to extend the time for collecting Taxes for the year 1860, in the County of Manitowoc.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The time for the voluntary payment of all taxes, except state taxes, on property in the county of Manitowoc, for the year 1860, levied pursuant to any law of this state, is hereby extended to the third Monday in July next, and it shall not be lawful for any town or village treasurer, in said county, to levy the same by distress and sale prior to said day.

Time extended.

SECTION 2. In all cases where the treasurer of any town or village in said county shall not have made his returns of delinquent taxes, before receiving notice of the passage of this act, he shall retain in his hands for collection all delinquent taxes, and may receive such of

Where treasurers have not made return, may receive taxes.
