

CHAPTER 117.

[Published March 26, 1862.]

AN ACT to perfect the records of Green Lake county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The supervisors of Green Lake county are hereby empowered to employ some suitable person to compare so much of the records of Green Lake county with the original records of Marquette county, as they may deem necessary, with authority to correct and perfect the same, and also to make such additional transcripts as may be necessary to complete and perfect the records of said county of Green Lake; and the person so appointed, after having perfected and compared said records as aforesaid, shall make and annex to said records a proper certificate or certificates, that such transcripts are full and complete copies of the original records, and of the whole thereof. When the records of said county of Green Lake shall have been completed and authenticated as hereinbefore mentioned, they shall be admitted and received in evidence in any action or proceeding, in like manner and with the same effect as the original records of Marquette county could be received in evidence.

Appointment of person to perfect records.

Records may be admitted in evidence.
