AN ACT to amend chapter 216 of the general laws of (A. D.) 1861, entitled "an act to apportion the state into senate and assembly districts."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Assembly districts in Green county.

Section 1. Section two of chapter 216 of the general laws of 1861, entitled "an act to apportion the state into senate and assembly districts," is hereby amended by striking out the word "Decatur" in assembly district number one of the county of Green, and by adding the word "Decatur" after the word "Cadiz," in assembly district number two of said county of Green, so that hereafter in the county of Green the assembly districts shall be described and constituted as follows: Number one shall consist of the towns of Mount Pleasant, Washington, Adams, York, New Glarus, Exeter, Brooklyn and Albany; number two shall consist of the towns of Spring Grove, Jefferson, Sylvester, Monroe, Clarno, Cadiz, Decatur and Jordan.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage and publication.
