AN ACT to appropriate to the institution for the education of the deaf and dumb, the sum of (\$12,200) twelve thousand two hundred dollars.

## CHAPTER 248.

[Published April 10, 1862.]

AN ACT to declare certain days legal holidays.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senats and assembly, do enact as follows:

Christmas and thanksgiving. SECTION 1. The twenty-fifth day of December, the first day of January, and any day appointed by the governor of this state or the president of the United States, as a day of public thanksgiving, are hereby declared to be holidays.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 249.
