and now remaining in his hands, may be used by said justice of the peace in the payment of such costs and liabilities as may have been heretofore incurred by his county, in enforcing the act to which this is amendatory.

Cranberries may be seized, &c.

to fine.

SECTION 3. All cranberries found in [the] possession of any person or persons in violation of the act to which this is amendetory, [amendatory,] shall be liable to seizure and sale by the proper officers of the county, the proceeds thereof to be applied to the payment of costs and expenses, as provided in section one of this Seller or puract; and any person or persons who may sell or purchaser net liable shape and the seller or purcha chase said berries as aforesaid, shall not be liable to prosecution or fine, as provided in the act hereby amended.

> This act shall take effect and be in force Section 4. from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 27.

[Published February 19, 1862.]

AN ACT to amend chapter 140 of the general laws of 1861, entitled "an act to amend chapter 134 of the revised statutes, entitled of executions and proceedings supplementary thereto."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amendment.

Section 1. Section one of chapter 140 of the general laws of 1861, is hereby amended by striking out the words "as provide in this act," and inserting in lieu thereof, "in the manner provided by law."
