

Application of
statutes.

SECTION 2. Section sixteen of chapter thirty-five of the revised statutes, shall not apply to the county of Waukesha, after this act takes effect.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 68.

[Published March 7, 1862.]

AN ACT for the relief of the town of Farmington, in the county of Polk.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

Equalization of
assessment of
1861.

SECTION 1. The town board of equalization of the town of Farmington, in the county of Polk, as constituted for the year 1861, is hereby authorized to re-equalize the real estate upon the assessment roll of said town for the year 1861.

Warrant—ex-
tension of term
of office of treas-
urer.

SECTION 2. The town clerk of said town shall calculate and carry out upon the assessment roll as re-equalized by virtue of this act, the taxes levied upon the property of said town for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and shall issue his warrant for the collection of the same; which warrant shall be directed to the town treasurer of said town, elected in the year 1861, whose term of office, for the purpose of collecting said tax, is hereby extended to the first day of June next; and no further proceedings shall be had by said town treasurer in collecting the taxes on the assessment roll now in his hands.

Extension of
time to collect
taxes.

SECTION 3. The time for collecting the taxes in said town for the year 1861, is hereby extended till the first day of June next.

Taxes of 1862.

SECTION 4. The town clerk of said town shall calculate and carry out upon the assessment roll, as required by virtue of this act, the taxes to be levied in said town for the year 1862.

Taxes paid.

SECTION 5. No person who has paid his tax for the year 1861, as carried out upon the assessment roll now

in the hands of said town treasurer, shall be required to pay his tax as carried out upon [the] assessment roll as re-equalized for the same year; and in all cases where persons have paid their taxes for the year 1861, as carried out upon the assessment roll now in the hands of the town treasurer, if the amount paid exceed the sum carried out upon the said re-equalized assessment roll, said town treasurer is authorized to refund to such person the excess.

SECTION 6. This act shall be published immediately, and shall take effect from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 73.

[Published March 10, 1862.]

AN ACT to extend the time for the collecting of taxes in the town of Eagle, in the county of Waukesha.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The time for collecting the taxes in the town of Eagle, in the county of Waukesha, is hereby extended until the first Monday of April next; and the treasurer of said town shall have the same right to levy on property and sell the same within said time so extended, as is now allowed by law for such purposes: *provided*, that nothing contained in this act shall be construed to extend the time for the payment of the state or county taxes, but they shall be paid as is now provided by law. Extended to
April 7th.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
