SESSION OF 1862.

NUMBER I.

JOINT RESOLUTION of the senate and assembly of the state of Wisconsin, requesting senators and members of congress to vote for abolishing [the] franking privilege, [privilege.]

Resolved, by the senate, the assembly concurring, That our senators in congress be requested to vote and use all honorable means to secure the passage of a law abolishing the present franking system, [system,] and that our representatives in congress who voted for the abolition of the present franking system [system] are entitled to the thanks of the people of this state.
