

CHAPTER 9.

[Published February 21, 1863.]

AN ACT for the relief of the Monroe county agricultural society.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*When order may
be issued in fa-
vor of.

SECTION 1. The secretary of state is hereby authorized and directed to issue an order upon the state treasurer, in favor of the Monroe county agricultural society, pursuant to section five of chapter fifty-three of the general laws of 1858, in the same manner as though the annual report of said society had been received on the first day of February, 1862: *provided*, said report be on file in the office of the secretary of state at the time of the passage of this act.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 10.

[Published February 21, 1863.]

AN ACT to amend chapter 320 of the general laws of 1860, entitled "an act to locate and establish school house sites."

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*Location of
school house
sites.

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter three hundred and twenty of the general laws of 1860, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows: "Whenever a school district shall be unable to obtain the school house site selected or designated by a majority of the electors at a regular meeting, on account of the refusal of the owner of the grounds selected to sell or lease the same, such site may be located and established by the town board of supervisors, who are hereby constituted a board to locate and establish school house sites in the manner hereinafter provided."

SECTION 2. Section eight of said chapter three hundred and twenty, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows: "Whenever the district is situated in two or more towns, the board shall consist of the supervisors of each of the towns in which such district is situated." When district is in two or more towns.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 11.

[Published February 21, 1863.]

AN ACT to provide for the assistance of volunteers in the service of the United States government.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 2 of the general laws of 1861, extra session, commencing May 15th of said year, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows: "It shall be lawful for any town, city or incorporated village, at any general or special meeting of the electors thereof, to raise and appropriate, by tax levied in the usual manner on all the taxable property, such sum or sums of money as may be deemed necessary for the support of families residing and being within such town, city or village, of volunteers or persons drafted into the military service of the United States government." Towns, cities and villages may raise money for support of families of volunteers.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
