

CHAPTER 148.

[Published April 7, 1863.]

AN ACT to empower the town of Spring Valley, in the county of Rock, to levy a tax for the payment of bounties to volunteers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The qualified electors of the town of Spring Valley, in the county of Rock, shall have power, at any legal meeting thereof, to vote to raise such sum or sums of money as they may deem necessary, for the payment of bounties to volunteers, residents of said town, mustered into the service of the United States or of this state, which has been heretofore pledged to such volunteers, or which has been paid or advanced, or to the discharge of any liabilities incurred by any person or persons, for or on account of any bounties pledged or paid to such volunteers.

Money may be raised to pay bounties advanced or pledged.

SECTION 2. In case the qualified electors of said town shall vote to raise any sum or sums of money, in accordance with the provisions of section one of this act, the board of supervisors of said town are hereby authorized and empowered to audit all claims and demands of all persons for money paid or liabilities incurred for such bounties, and to draw orders on the town treasury for the payment of all sums so audited and allowed by them, to be paid out of the money voted or raised under the provisions of this act; and all moneys voted to be raised by virtue of the provisions of this act, shall be assessed and collected in the same manner as other town taxes.

An fitting and payment of claims.

SECTION 3. Special town meetings may be called for the purposes specified in this act, in the manner now provided by law for calling special town meetings.

Special meetings.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
