CHAPTER 149.

AN ACT to approve and confirm the form of conveyances heretofore executed by the city of Janesville, of lands sold for unpaid taxes due to said city.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Beeds and conveyances declared valid. Section 1. All deeds or conveyances of lands sold for taxes due to the city of Janesville, heretofore or hereinafter [hereafter] executed and issued, pursuant to and in conformity with chapter 108 of the private and local laws of the year 1858, entitled "an act to reduce the law incorporating the city of Janesville, and the several acts amendatory thereof, into one act, and amend the same," approved March 25th, 1858, shall be as valid and effectual, for all purposes, as if said deeds or conveyances had been executed and issued in conformity to chapter 22 of the general laws of 1859, entitled "an act relative to the sale of lands for unpaid taxes, and the conveyance and redemption thereof," approved February 19th, 1859, and the several acts supplemental thereto and amendatory thereof.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage.
