CHAPTER 366.

AN ACT to authorize Pembroke B. Stearns to erect and maintain a boom on the Wisconsin river, in Wood county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That Pembroke B. Stearns, his asso-Authority to ciates, successors and assigns, are hereby authorized build boom. and empowered to erect and maintain a boom across the Wisconsin river, upon section fifteen, township twenty-one, north of range five east, in the county of Wood, for the purpose of stopping and securing logs, spars, square timber and other lumber: provided, that not be construed so as to authorize the said Pembroke B. Stearns, his associate or assigns, to obstruct the free navigation of said river.

SECTION 2. Any future legislature may alter, amend May amend, &c.

or repeal this act.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
