

## CHAPTER 98.

[Published March 27, 1863.]

AN ACT to legalize the acts of J. B. Ribble, a justice of the peace in Dodge county.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. The official acts of J. B. Ribble, a justice of the peace in the village of Horicon, Dodge county, are hereby declared to be lawful, notwithstanding the requirements of the law have not all been complied with in filing the bond and oath. Acts legalized.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 99.

[Published March 27, 1863.]

AN ACT to legalize the acts of A. J. Rising, a notary public in the county of Dodge.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. The official acts of A. J. Rising, a notary public in Dodge county, are hereby declared to be lawful, notwithstanding an intermission existed between the expiration of a former commission and the date of his present commission. Acts legalized.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
