

SECTION 5. It shall be lawful for said association ^{Other officers.} to elect or appoint a secretary and such other officers as the condition and circumstances of the corporation may require, and to prescribe their powers and duties, and require bonds for the faithful performance thereof, in such penal sum and with such sureties as they may choose.

SECTION 6. The trustees shall hold their term of ^{Terms of office.} office for one year, and all the other officers shall hold their term of office for the space of six months, except when otherwise provided for in their constitution.

SECTION 7. It shall be the duty of the secretary to ^{Duty of secretary.} keep and file in his office all the books and papers belonging to said corporation, and copy all the by-laws made by said corporation in a book kept for that purpose, and shall also enter in said books the names of all persons who may become members of said corporation.

SECTION 8. The property, real and personal, of said ^{Descent of property.} association, shall be devoted solely to the purpose and object of said association, and all real and personal estate which may hereafter be lawfully conveyed by devise, gift, grant, purchase or otherwise to said association, shall descend, with improvements, in perpetual succession, and shall be held by said trustees and their successors in office, in trust for said corporation.

SECTION 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 174.

[Published April 2, 1864.]

AN ACT to incorporate the society of the "English and German Christian academy of the city of Watertown, Wisconsin."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. August Volkman, Gerhard Lohmann, ^{Corporators.} George Marquart, Adolph Dippel, Gustave Eberle and Friederich Hempel, their associates and successors, are

hereby created a body corporate and politic, for the purposes of Christian education, in perpetual succession, under the name and title of the "English and German Christian academy of the city of Watertown, Wisconsin," with full power to sue and be sued, to plead and be impleaded, in all courts of law and elsewhere, to hold and convey property, real and personal, to have and use a common seal, and to alter and renew the same at pleasure, and to adopt such by-laws, rules and regulations as the members of said "English and German Christian academy" may deem necessary for the government of said society, not inconsistent with the constitution of the United States and the state of Wisconsin.

Name and powers.

Board of trustees—their term of office.

SECTION 2. The affairs of said "English and German Christian academy" shall be managed by a board of six trustees, of whom four shall be a quorum, and who may elect annually from among themselves, a president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer. The trustees shall hold their offices for the term of three years. All the proceedings of the board shall be in German.

Application of funds.

SECTION 3. All sums of money paid in by subscription, all gifts, devises, bequests and contributions to the "English and German Christian academy," shall be faithfully applied by the trustees to carry out the object thereof; and for the benefit and information of all concerned, said trustees shall report annually at the general meeting of the society on the first Tuesday of January, of all receipts, expenditures, finances and general standing of this society.

May hold real estate, &c.

SECTION 4. The "English and German Christian academy" may hold or convey real estate to an amount not exceeding fifty thousand dollars.

First election of trustees.

SECTION 5. The first election of trustees under this act shall be held within four weeks after the same shall have become a law, and shall be conducted by three members of the society, to be chosen by a majority of all members of the society convened for the purpose, at which election six persons, full members of this society, shall be chosen to serve as trustees until their successors, respectively, are elected; and the trustees so elected shall meet on the first Tuesday after their election, and shall at their first meeting divide themselves by lot into three classes, (1, 2, 3.) The time of

First meeting, and classification of trustees.

service of the first class shall expire on the first Tuesday in the month of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, that of the second class shall expire on the first Tuesday in the month of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and the time of service of the third class shall expire on the first Tuesday in the month of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, so that one-third may be chosen every year after the first election, which elections are to be held on the said first Tuesday of the month of January, in every succeeding year, or at such other time as may be prescribed by the by-laws. Two persons qualified according to this section, shall be elected to serve as trustees for three years.

SECTION 6. Any male person of proper age, leading a Christian life, acknowledging the whole bible as the infallible word of God, and being a member of a Christian congregation, may become a member of this society. Qualification of membership.

SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 180.

AN ACT to incorporate "Marquette college," in the second ward of the city of Milwaukee.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. That Stanislaus P. Lalumiere, James M. Hayes and Ignatius Maes, and their successors, be and hereby are created a body corporate and politic, under the name and style of "Marquette college," and shall be trustees of said corporation for the purpose of maintaining and conducting an institution of learning, and by said corporate name to remain in perpetual succession, with full power to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, to receive, acquire and hold property, real and personal, by bequest, donation or purchase, Corporators and trustees.
