## CHAPTER 219.

[Published April 7, 1864.]

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and twenty-two of the private and local [general] laws of 1868, entitled "an act to amend the charter of the Platteville and Calamine railroad company."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Route changed.

Connections.

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter one hundred and twenty-two of the private and local [general] laws of 1863, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows: "That section ten of an act to incorporate the Platteville and Calamine railroad company, be amended, so as to read as follows : 'The said company shall have power to locate and construct, and perpetually to have, use and enjoy, a railroad, with one or more railway tracks, from the village of Plattevile, in the county of Grant, by way of Calamine, in the town of Willow Springs, in the county of La Fayette, to Janesville, in the county of Rock, or to the village of Monroe, in Green county, and also to any point on the Illinois state line in Green or La Fayette county, and also from Platteville to any point on the Mississippi river, or other point in Grant county, and to connect such railroad with any other railroad, and to consolidate said corporation with any other railroad corporation or other company, as they may deem expedient.'"

SECTION 2. This act shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage.
