

CHAPTER 22.

[Published February 11, 1864.]

AN ACT to legalize the town meeting of the town of Perry, in the county of Dane, held January 11th, 1864.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Special town meeting, &c. legalised.

SECTION 1. The special town meeting of the town of Perry, in Dane county, held on the eleventh day of January, 1864, for the purpose of raising a special tax to pay extra bounties to volunteers into the military service of this state or the United States, is hereby declared legal and valid for all the intents and purposes for which the same was held; and all acts done in pursuance of the vote or votes of said meeting, by the officers of said town, or any of them, are hereby declared valid, the same as if the law had been fully complied with in notifying and conducting said meeting.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 23.

AN ACT to legalize the acts of a certain town meeting held on the 16th day of January, A. D. 1864, in the town of Dodgeville, Iowa county, Wisconsin, and the tax voted at such meeting.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Town meeting and tax legalised

SECTION 1. The town meeting held in the town of Dodgeville, Iowa county, Wisconsin, on the 16th day of January, A. D. 1864, for the purpose of raising money, by special tax, to pay town bounties to volunteers in the military service of the United States, is hereby declared legal and valid to all intents and purposes for which the same was held; and said tax shall be levied and collected with other town taxes for the year 1864, and in like manner: *provided*, that the board
