and laid out on the Fremont division of the said Osh-kosh and Wausau railroad.

SECTION 8. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 310.

[Published April 20, 1864.]

AN ACT to amend section 74 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes, entitled "of highways and bridges, and of ferries."

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Roads may be laid out three rods wide, SECTION 1. Section 74 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes, is hereby amended, to read as follows: "The supervisors of the several towns in this state, shall have power to lay out public roads of the width of three rods, when in their opinion a road of greater width is not needed.

Legal highways.

SECTION 2. Any roads which have been heretofore laid out of the width of three rods, and not ordered open, shall be deemed legal highways when an order of the supervisors to open said roads shall be filed with the town clerk; and any persons considering themselves aggrieved by the opening of such road, shall have the same privilege of appeal after the service of the order to open said road, as is now provided in the laying out and establishing highways in said chapter 19.

Appeals.

SECTION 8. This act to be in force from and after

its passage.
