CHAPTER 811.

AN ACT to incorporate the Waupun and Rock river railway company.

CHAPTER 312.

[Published April 20, 1864.]

AN ACT to vacate the plat of the village of Helena, in Iowa county, Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The plat of the village of Helena, in vector. Iowa county, Wisconsin, laid out on fractional lots three and four, in section number thirty, township number eight, north of range number four, east of the fourth principal meridian, is declared to be and the same is hereby vacated.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 818.

AN ACT to vacate a portion of Palmatary sireet, in the village of Horizon.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented **th** senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. That portion of Palmatary street, in Vacand. the village of Horicon, which extends from Walnut 1

street to Maple street, in said village, is hereby vacated.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 314.

AN ACT to legalize a special town meeting held in the town of Forest, Fond du Lac county, for the purpose of raising money, by tax, to pay volunteers who may enlist in the military service of the United States, from the said town of Forest.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Meeting and tax logalized.

SECTION 1. The special town meeting held in the town of Forest, Fond du Lac county, Wisconsin, on the 7th day of March, 1864, for the purpose of raising money, by tax, to pay volunteers who might thereafter enlist in the military service of the United States, as stated in the notice for said meeting, and also the tax roll subsequently made out and delivered to the treasurer of said town, are hereby declared to be legal and valid for all purposes whatsoever.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
