## CHAPTER 380.

[Published April 21, 1864.]

AN ACT to provide for laying out a state road from Black River Falls, in Jackson county, to Chippewa Falls, in Chippewa county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Harris Searl, of Eau Claire county, Commissioners. and James Melville and Rodman Palmer, of Chippewa county, are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a state road from Black River Falls, in Jackson county, to Chippewa Falls, in Chippewa county.

The said commissioners shall receive Their compen-Section 2. for laying out said road, such compensation for their services, from the counties through which said road shall pass, as the supervisors of such counties shall deem just and reasonable, but no money shall be paid out of the state treasury therefor.

Section 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 331.

AN ACT to provide for the punishment of certain offenses against log-owners.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. If any owner, lessee, operator or other Penalty for reperson in the occupancy and possession of any lumber to owner his or shingle mill in this state, shall manufacture logs immer, 4c. other than his own, into lumber, timber, pickets or shingles, and shall neglect or refuse, within thirty days after so demanded to do, to deliver to the person or persons, or corporation, such share or proportion of
