

CHAPTER 399.

AN ACT to provide for and prescribe the compensation of clerks of the county boards of supervisors.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The several clerks of the county boards of supervisors of this state, shall receive as compensation for their services, in lieu of all fees and emoluments now by law received by them for such services, a salary to be fixed and prescribed by the county board of supervisors of their respective counties, as hereinafter provided. Clerks of boards to be salaried offices.

SECTION 2. At the annual meeting in November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the county boards of supervisors for the several counties, shall fix and determine the amount of the annual salary that the clerk of the county board of supervisors of their respective counties shall receive, and thereafter the salary of each clerk of the county board of supervisors shall be fixed by the county board of supervisors at its annual meeting after his election and before the commencement of his term of office, and such salary shall not be increased or diminished during his said term of office. When salary to be fixed.

SECTION 3. The salary thus determined upon shall be paid out of the county treasury, out of any moneys not otherwise appropriated, and may be paid at the end of each and every quarter. When salary payable.

SECTION 4. The fees now allowed by law to clerks of the county boards of supervisors, shall be collected by them and paid into the treasury of the county, for the use of the county. Fees to be paid into treasury.

SECTION 5. All acts and parts of acts conflicting with this act, are hereby repealed. Repeal.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
