GENERAL LAWS-CH. 47, 48.

CHAPTER 47.

[Published February 17, 1864.]

AN ACT giving to justices of the peace jurisdiction over and cognizance of certain actions and proceedings.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Actions to enforce payment of bounty subscriptions, may be brought before justices.

SECTION 1. Any and all actions authorized to be brought by the town, village or city treasurer of any town, village or city, by chapter two hundred and ninety-five of the general laws of 1863, cognizable before a justice of the peace, may be prosecuted before any justice of the peace in the county in which such town, village or city treasurer holds his office.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 48.

[Published February 17, 1864.]

AN ACT to extend the time for the collection of taxes in the town of Prairie du Chien, in Crawford county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Extended to April 1.

SECTION 1. The time for the collection of taxes in the town of Prairie du Chien, in the county of Crawford, is hereby extended until the first day of April next: *provided*, this act shall not affect the collection and paying over of the state and county taxes for said town.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
