CHAPTER 60.

AN ACT in relation to Protestant Episcopal churches in Wisconsin

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The rector, wardens and vestrymen, Choice of rector, being the trustees of each Protestant Episcopal church wardens and vesincorporated within this state, may be chosen at such times and in such manner as may be in conformity to the rules and usages of such church, and elections or appointments of such officers heretofore made in conformity to such rules and usages, are declared to be valid.

SECTION 2. Each Protestant Episcopal church hereto- May hold lands fore or hereafter incorporated within this state, may for burial purpotake by purchase, devise, gift or otherwise, and may forever hold, any lands intended to be used for cemetery grounds or burial purposes; and all grants, gifts, conveyances or devises of lands heretofore made to any incorporated Protestant Episcopal church, shall be valid and effectual, according to the intent of the parties.

SECTION 3. Sections 14, 15 and 16 of chapter six- Application of ty-seven of the revised statutes, shall apply to all lands statutes. so heretofore or hereafter acquired or held for burial purposes.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
