

CHAPTER 66.

[Published February 24, 1864.]

AN ACT to repeal chapter two hundred and sixty-two of the general laws of 1862, entitled "an act to authorize the governor to appoint surgeons in certain cases."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Chapter two hundred and sixty-two of the general laws of 1862, being an act entitled "an act to authorize the governor to appoint surgeons in certain cases," is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 67.

[Published February 25, 1864.]

AN ACT to authorize the city of Madison to compromise its bonded indebtedness.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The common council of the city of Madison are hereby authorized to negotiate and effect a settlement and compromise of the bonded indebtedness of said city, and for that purpose are hereby fully empowered to issue new bonds of said city, payable in twenty years from the first day of April, A. D. 1864, bearing interest at a rate not exceeding seven per cent. per annum, payable annually on the first day of April, both interest and principal payable in the city of New York. Said bonds shall have coupons annexed, in the usual form, for the annual payments of interest, which, together with said bonds, shall be appropriately numbered, and shall be signed by the mayor and countersigned by the city clerk. The bonds shall be for such sums, not exceeding one thousand dollars each, as shall be found

Council authorized to compromise, and to issue new bonds.
