## GENERAL LAWS-CH. 99.

## CHAPTER 99.

[Published March 5, 1864.]

AN ACT to legalize all the proceedings of a special town meeting for the purpose of raising bounties for volunteers, in the town of Packwaukee, Marquette county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Special town mosting and levelined SECTION 1. All the proceedings and acts had and held prior to and at a certain special town meeting or election, held in the town of Packwaukee, Marquette county, Wisconsin, on the sixteenth day of February, A. D. 1864, [and] the tax and interest voted to be levied for bounties to volunteers who shall thereafter enlist and be credited to said town, in the next ensuing draft, are hereby declared to be legal and valid for all purposes whatever, notwithstanding an defects, omissions or insufficiencies in the notices, time or manner of posting the same, or in holding and conducting said special town meeting or election.

Tax legalized.

SECTION 2. The tax and interest voted to be levied upon the taxable property of the town of Packwaukee, Marquette county, for the purpose of paying bounties to volunteers, at a special town meeting held in and for said town of Packwaukee, in Marquette county, on the sixteenth day of February, A. D. 1864, are hereby legalized, and declared to be legal and valid for all purposes whatever.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
