vision, and by inserting in lieu thereof the words, "be fixed and established by the city council, who shall have power and authority to establish either uniform or graduated rates for selling liquors in said city, as they may deem most expedient."

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage and publication.

AN ACT to repeal chapter 182 of the private and local [general] laws of 1864, entitled "an act to amend an act to incorporate the Sinsinawa Mound college."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 132 of the private and local Repeating [general] laws of 1864, entitled "an act to amend an act entitled 'an act to incorporate the Sinsinawa Mound college," is hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force

CHAPTER 409.

AN ACT relating to absent, non-resident or concealed defendants, in certain cases.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. When it appears by the record in any Proceedings action or proceeding, that judgment has been recovered presentation against any parties as absent, concealed, or non-resisent, concealed dent defendants, by the service of the summons under or non-recidents 83gr.
