AN ACT to authorize the Oak Hill cemetery association to sell a portion of its grounds, and establish a new cemetery at the city of Watertown.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

May sell grounds SECTION 1. The Oak Hill cemetery association of the said city of Watertown, in this state, is hereby authorized and empowered to sell any and all of its grounds in the 3d ward of said city, which it has not disposed of to lot owners, and also such portions of its said cemetery grounds as may be voluntarily surrendered to it by lot owners, and dispose of the same for agricultural or any other legitimate purposes, and use the proceeds of such sale or sales for improvement and purchase of other cemetery grounds; and a deed or deeds of any such grounds as are hereby authorized to be sold in the name of said association, and duly acknowledged by its president and secretary, shall be effectual to pass its title thereof.

May purchase other grounds. SECTION 2. Said association is hereby authorized and empowered to purchase so much of section three (8,) in the second ward of said city, as his cast [lies east] of that part of Rock river which runs through the said section, as it may desire, and locate thereon a cemetery to be called "Oak Hill cemetery."

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
