 AN ACT to enable the boards of supervisors of the towns in this state, to repair bridges in certain cases.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

May repair bridges, and put amount into next tax list.

SECTION 1. It shall be lawful for the supervisors of any town in this state, whenever bridges need repairs in their towns, and not a sufficient amount of money has been provided by the town for such purposes, to repair or cause to be repaired said bridges to an amount not exceeding five hundred dollars in any one year; and it shall be the duty of the clerk of said town to put the amount so expended into the next tax list, and it shall be collected, returned and disbursed in the same manner as other contingent funds of the town.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## [CHAPTER 132.

 AN ACT to vest the title of unredeemed lands in counties.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

When title shall vest in county.

SECTION 1. Whenever any lot or tract of land shall be or shall have been for five successive years sold for taxes, and bid in for the county, and remain unredeemed, the title thereof shall absolutely vest in the county where such lot or tract of land is situate, and when so vested, shall not be liable to assessment for taxes of any kind or description.

Lands may be sold.

SECTION 2. The county board of supervisors shall have full authority to sell and convey any and all such lands, the title to which has become vested in the county,

on such terms as they shall deem proper, and the proceeds therefrom shall be paid into the general or contingent fund of the county.

SECTION 3. Nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to apply to lands owned by minors, or persons who are *non compos mentis*, insane, or under guardianship: *provided*, that the provisions of this act shall not apply to any tax certificate now issued, until two years from and after the passage and publication of this act. Construction.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 133.

[Published April 28, 1866.]

AN ACT to amend section 4, chapter 166, revised statutes, entitled  
“of forgery and counterfeiting.”

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate  
and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section four of chapter 166 of the revised statutes, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows: “Section 4. Every person who shall make, alter, forge or counterfeit any bank bill, treasury note, promissory note, draft, bond, or other evidence of debt issued by the United States, or any corporation or company duly authorized for that purpose by the laws of the United States, or of any state of the United States, or of any territory of the United States, or of any other state, government or country, with intent to injure or defraud, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison, not more than five years nor less than one year.” Forging bank  
notes, &c.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
