The people of the state of Wisconsın, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Sections seven, eight, nine and ten of Repeal. chapter 212 of the general laws of 1863, entitled "an act to provide for the enrollment of persons liable to perform military duty, and the organization of the state militia for active service," is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent Repeal. with this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect immediately, and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 16.

[Published March 20, 1866.]

AN ACT to amend chapter 52 of the revised statutes, entitled " of restraining [distraining] sheep running at large, &c."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter fifty two of the Diseased sheep not to run at revised statutes, enfitled "of restraining [distraining] large-pendity sheep running at large, &c.," is hereby amended, so as recoverable. to read as follows: "If the owner of any diseased sheep, infected with the disease known as ' foot rot.' or 2GL
