

# GENERAL LAWS.

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## CHAPTER 1.

[Published January 29, 1866.]

AN ACT to amend chapter 109 of the general laws of the year 1864, entitled "an act to authorize the county of Brown to issue bonds for the erection of county buildings."

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate, and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section five of chapter one hundred and nine of the general laws of the year 1864, is hereby amended, by striking out the name of Talbot C. Dousman, and inserting in place thereof the name of Andrew Reid. <sup>Amendment.</sup>

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

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## CHAPTER 2.

[Published February 1, 1866.]

AN ACT authorizing certain insurance companies to transact business in this state.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Any insurance company which had, prior to the first of November, 1865, deposited state bonds with the state treasurer, as required by section one, chapter 320, of the general laws for the year 1865, although subsequently to the time fixed by said law, is hereby authorized to transact the business of insurance <sup>Certain insurance companies may do business in this state,</sup>

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in this state, the same as though such bonds had been so deposited on or before the first day of June, 1865: *provided*, that said company shall in all other respects comply with the requirements of the laws of this state relating to insurance companies.

Issue of certificates.

SECTION 2. The state treasurer and secretary of state are respectively authorized to issue certificates, as provided in sections 3 and 8 of chap. 320 of the laws of 1865, to any such company.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

### CHAPTER 3.

[*Published February 23, 1866.*]

AN ACT to define the duties of the secretary of state and state treasurer, in reference to the disbursements of the revenues of the state.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

Payments from treasury only to be made on warrants of secretary of state.

SECTION 1. All payments of money from the state treasury, shall be made upon the warrant of the secretary of state; and it shall be unlawful for the secretary of state to credit the state treasurer for any sum of money paid out otherwise than as provided in this act.

Be repealed.

SECTION 2. All acts and parts of acts contravening the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
