senate and assembly: provided, that the compensation of such clerks shall not exceed the sum of three dol-

lars per day.

The chairman of the committee for Certificates of Section 2. which such service has been rendered, shall execute to the person who performed the same, a certificate of the amount due for such services; and upon presentation of such certificate to the secretary of state, he shall audit and allow the same, and issue his draft for the amount upon the state treasurer, who is hereby authorized to pay the same.

This act shall take effect and be in force Section 3.

from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 10.

[Published February 26, 1867.]

AN ACT to provide for evidence in certain cases.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Copies of any record, paper, file or copies of recomemorandum made or kept in the office of the adju jutant general. tant-general of this state, when certified by the adjutant-general having charge or custody thereof, shall be, in or before any court or tribunal, prima facie evidence of the matters or things so certified.

SECTION 2. The certificate of the adjutant-general certificates of certifying any fact, matter or thing relative to any adjutant general. thing appearing of record or otherwise in his office. shall be, in or before any court or tribunal, prima facie evidence of the fact, matter or thing so certified.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage.
