

SECTION 2. All moneys paid from the general fund for expenses of the regents of the university of Wisconsin, or for any other expenses not in accordance with the construction of the law directed by section one of this act, shall be drawn by the treasurer of the state, on the warrant of the secretary of state, which is hereby authorized and directed to be issued, from the income of the trust fund to which such expenses are properly chargeable, and returned to the general fund.

How moneys for expenses of regents to be drawn.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

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## CHAPTER 141.

[Published April 15, 1867.]

AN ACT in relation to the circuit court for Dane county.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The presiding judge of the circuit court for the county of Dane, in the state of Wisconsin, is hereby authorized to appoint a short-hand reporter, whose duty it shall be to attend upon each term of said court, for the purpose of recording the oral testimony of the witnesses, and such other matter as the presiding judge of said court may direct; the said short-hand reporter to be a sworn officer of the court, and well skilled in his art, and fully competent to discharge the duties required.

Short-hand reporter may be appointed, &c.

SECTION 2. The short-hand reporter thus appointed shall be allowed a compensation, to be fixed by the presiding judge of said court, of not less than five (5) and not more than seven (7) dollars per day for each day's attendance, which sum shall be audited, certified and paid in like manner as prescribed by law for the payment of the sheriff and other officers attendant upon the court.

Compensation.

SECTION 3. When either or both of the parties in any cause thus reported, shall desire a transcription of

Transcripts of records—payment therefor.

said record or any part thereof, a fair transcript shall be made forthwith by the said short-hand reporter, at a cost not to exceed five (5) cents per folio of one hundred words; the said cost to be paid by the party or parties requiring such transcript, except in trials on indictment, when the court may order such transcript to be made, audited and paid in the same manner as the reporter's per diem compensation; and in case said transcript shall be embodied in any bill of exceptions used on an appeal or writ of error, the amount paid for the same shall be taxed as a proper and just disbursement in the action in favor of the party procuring the same, if he shall be the prevailing party on such appeal or writ of error.

Reporter may be removed.

SECTION 4. The said reporter so appointed may at any time be removed for misconduct or inattention to his duties, and another be appointed in his stead.

How long to remain in force.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication, and shall remain in force until the first day of July, 1868.

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## CHAPTER 142.

[Published April 19, 1867.]

AN ACT to amend chapter eleven of the revised statutes, entitled "of salaries of state officers and others," and chapter 422 of the general laws of 1865, relative to the salaries of the corresponding secretary and librarian of the state historical society.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

Salaries of corresponding secretary and librarian state historical society.

SECTION 1. That so much of chapter eleven of the revised statutes, "of salaries of state officers and others," as relates to the salary of the corresponding secretary of the state historical society, and of section 1, chapter 422 of the general laws of 1865, as relates to the salaries of the corresponding secretary and librarian of said society, be and are hereby amended, so as to read as follows: "For salary of the corresponding secretary of the state historical society, one
