' CHAPTER 55.

AN ACT requiring the state superintendent of public property, the superintendents, board of managers or trustees of the several charitable institutions supported by the state, to purchase certain articles therein named of their respective institutions.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of the state super-Furniture, &c intendent of public property, the superintendent of to be purchased the state hospital for the insane, the institute for the dot state institueducation of the blind, the institute for the education of the deaf and dumb, the state reform school, and the soldiers' orphans' home, whenever any article or articles of furniture, boots, shoes or brooms are required for their several institutions or their inmates, amounting to over twenty-five dollars, that the state is required to purchase, to make out a list of all such articles of furniture, boots, shoes or brooms, as soon as may be after their wants are known, and transmit the same with all convenient speed to the state prison commissioner, at Waupun, or to the superintendent, managers or trustees of some one of the charitable institutions supported by the state; and upon the receipt of the list aforesaid by the commissioner, managers or trustees that may receive it, it shall be his or their duty, without unnecessary delay, to cause to be manufactured, of good materials and in a good workmanlike manner, the article or articles of furniture, boots, shoes or brooms named in the list aforesaid, and sell the same to the person or persons so ordering them at as low a price, for cash, as they can purchase the same articles elsewhere, of equal value and goodness: provided, that if the state Proviso. prison commissioner, superintendent, board of managers or trustees of any of the charitable institutions of the state to whom the list is sent, shall not be able to manufacture the article or articles, boots, shoes or brooms therein mentioned, the person or persons so ordering them shall have the right to purchase them at such place or places as will promote the best interests of the state.

This act shall be liberally construed so Repealed. SECTION 2.

as to accomplish the object intended, and all acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. So much of section 1 of chapter 94 of the private and local laws of 1866, entitled "an act to change the times for holding the terms of the circuit court in the several counties of the first judicial circuit," approved March 10th, 1866, as provides for holding a law term of said court in the county of Walworth, on the third Monday in June, in each year, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
