CHAPTER 30.

AN ACT to repect sections 1, 3 and 4 of chapter 29 of the general laws of 1866, entitled "an act to protect the hop-growing interests of the state, and indicate the size of boxes used for picking hops in Wisconsin."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Repealed.

SECTION 1. Sections one, three and four of chapter 29 of the general laws of 1866, entitled "an act to protect the hop-growing interests of the state, and indicate the size of boxes used for picking hops in Wisconsin," are hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

on and after the first day of July next.

CHAPTER 31.

[Published February 26, 1868.]

AN ACT in relation to county supervisors in counties containing less than three towns.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Legalized.

SECTION 1. The election of county boards of supervisors, at the last general election, consisting of three members to hold office for the succeeding two years in counties containing less than three towns, is hereby legalized and declared valid.

Term of office and how determined. SECTION 2. The present members of such boards shall hold office, one for one year, one for two years and one for three years, from the commencement of their present term; which one of these several terms each member shall serve. The board shall determine, at least sixty days before the next general election, by
