## CHAPTER 111.

AN ACT to amend section 1 of chapter 164 of the general laws of 1865, entitled "an act to amend chapter 40 of the general laws of 1861, entitled "an act requiring owners of certain machines to guard against accidents."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1 of chapter 164 of the general laws of 1865, entitled "an act to amend chapter 40 of the general laws of 1861, entitled 'an act requiring owners of certain machines to guard against accidents," is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section one of chapter 40 of the general laws of 1861, entitled an act requiring owners of certain machines to guard against accidents is hereby amended so as to read as follows: The joints or knuckles and jacks of the tumbling rods of all threshing machines hereafter used in this state, except S. N. Taylor's knuckle or coupling, patented February 16, 1864, and except J. I. Case & Co.'s safety knuckle or coupling. known as the universal safety knuckle and C. W. Yates' safety coupling or kuckle, patented December, 11, 1866, and except A. J. Langworthy's patent safety knuckle or universal joint, shall be securely enclosed in a box.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
