CHAPTER 154.

[Published March 16, 1869.]

AN ACT relating to irregular assessment.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. No assessment of real property for the purpose of taxation here of ore made, or which shall be hereafter made by the assessors of any of the towns, willages or cities of this state, shall be held or deemed to be invalid or irregular for the reason that several lots, tracts or parcels of land have been valued and assessed together as one parcel and not separately, where the several lots, tracts or parcels of land so valued and assessed together as one parcel are contiguous and owned by the same person at the time of such valuation and assessment by the assessor; and all such assessments and the subsequent proceedings based thereon, are hereby declared to be legal and valid in all respects as if the said several lots, tracts or parcels of land had been separately valued and assessed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in

force from and after its passage.
