

state treasury received from collections made by said agent or agents in pursuance of this act.

SECTION 6. Whenever said agent or agents shall become possessed of any money, being the proceeds of the state [sale] of any logs or timber cut on or being upon said lands, and shall fail to pay the same over as provided in this act, or shall wilfully convert the same to his own use, or to the use of any other person, he shall be deemed guilty of the crime of embezzlement, and punished accordingly.

Failure of agent to pay over moneys to be punished for embezzlement.

SECTION 7. Whenever the northern Wisconsin railway company shall file with the state treasurer satisfactory proof that the title to any of said lands has become vested in said company, by virtue of the construction of their said railway, or any part thereof, the state treasurer shall pay over to said company all moneys which shall have been collected and paid into said treasury by said agent or agents, for trespass committed on the lands so vested.

When northern Wisconsin railway company shall be entitled to moneys.

SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 47.

[Published March 4, 1869.]

AN ACT to repeal chapter 277 of the general laws of 1864, entitled "an act authorizing the St. Croix and Lake Superior railroad company to protect their lands and the timber thereon."

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Chapter 277 of the general laws of 1864, entitled "an act authorizing the St. Croix and Lake Superior railroad company to protect their lands and the timber thereon," is hereby repealed.

Repealed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
