CHAPTER 34.

[Published March 10, 1870.]

AN ACT to amend section 18 of chapter 120 of the revised statutes in relation to claims against railroad companies.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section eighteen of chapter one hundered and twenty of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto the words: "provided, that in all actions for damages against any railroad company or corporation operating any railroad within this state under any lease or otherwise, the process may be served upon any agent of the corporation against which the damage is claimed, who has charge of a depot or station on the line of railroad owned or operated by said company or corporation."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in

force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 35.

[Published March 10, 1870.]

AN ACT to provide for the payment of the chief messenger of the assembly.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The per diem of the chief messenger of Per diem of the assembly is hereby fixed at three dollars per day, and there is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum sufficient to pay the per diem of said messenger.

SECTION 2. This act shall apply to the whole term

of the present session of the legislature.
