cases in which to store and preserve the colors and flags of our various regiments, batteries and detachments having such colors or flags, engaged in the late war: *provided*, that the cost of such cases shall not exceed the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars.

How placed.

SECTION 2. The cases shall have glass fronts and of sufficient size to receive all such colors or flags, placing them therein so that they can all be labeled, and when so labeled, seen with the labels from the outside, and without opening the cases.

SECTION 3. The label shall be placed in a conspicuous place on the colors or flags, and shall state the number of the regiment, and also, briefly, the battles, sieges and campaigns in which the regiment, battery or detachment was engaged.

SECTION 4. The quartermaster general shall certify the correctness of all expenditures incurred under the provisions of this act, and when the same is approved by the governor, file such certificate in the office of the secretary of state, and thereupon the secretary of state shall issue his warrant upon the state treasurer for the amount so certified and approved in favor of the parties to whom the same may be due.

SECTION 5. There is hereby appropriated, out of the general fund, a sum sufficient to meet the requirements of this act.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 83.

AN ACT to amend chapter 179 of the general laws of 1867, ertitled "an act to regulate insurance companies not incorporated by the state of Wisconsin."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter one hundred and seventy-nine of the general laws of 1867, is hereby

amended by adding, at the end of said section, the words following: "Such certificate and license shall be void until countersigned by the state treasurer, who shall countersign the same after and not before the payment into the state treasury, of the license fee hereinafter mentioned."

CHAPTER 84.

[Published March 22, 1870.]

AN ACT to repeal chapter 129 of the general laws of 1861, and reinstate sections 25, 85 and 49 of chapter 13, and sections 63 and 94 of chapter 15 of the revised statutes, "of counties and county officers."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That chapter one hundred and twenty-Repealed. nine of the general laws of 1861, an act entitled an act to amend chapter thirteen of the revised statutes, and all acts amendatory thereof, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. Sections 25, 85 and 49 of chapter 13, Revived. and sections 63 and 94 of chapter 15 of the revised statutes, and all other laws relating to the powers and duties of supervisors or their election, which were repealed or amended by said chapter 129, are hereby revived, re instated and declared to be of full force: *provided*, that the present supervisors shall remain in office until the first Tuesday in April next.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
