

JOINT RESOLUTIONS.

NUMBER 1.

JOINT RESOLUTION providing for the purchase and distribution of 1,000 copies of the "Legislative Manual" year 1870.

Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That the superintendent of public property be directed to furnish for the use of the legislature, 1,000 copies of the Legislative Manual for 1870: *provided* they can be furnished in ten days, said manuals to be distributed as follows: ten copies to each state officer; 25 copies to the State Historical Society for distribution; 25 copies to the secretary of state for exchanges; six copies each to the chief clerks and sergeant-at-arms of the senate and assembly, and one copy to each of the clerks in the several state departments and to the principal officer of the several state institutions, and one copy to each reporter in attendance at this session, and six copies to each member of the senate and assembly: *provided further,* that the price for said manuals shall not exceed \$2 00 per copy.

JOINT RESOLUTION relative to American citizens confined in foreign prisons.

WHEREAS, Many American citizens are now and have been for a long time past, confined in English prisons for the alleged crime of seeking to restore to the land of their birth her lost liberties; and

WHEREAS, These American citizens are at least entitled to our sympathy if not to the protection of this their government; therefore,
