## CHAPTER 130.

[Published April 6, 1872.]

AN ACT to appropriate to D. K. Tenney the sum of ninety dollars, for services rendered the state of Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated, out of appropriated any money in the general fund, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of ninety dollars, to D. K. Tenney, in full payment for services as clerk and attorney of the committee on the assessment and collection of taxes in the assembly in the year 1869; also for preparing and drawing two bills to simplify, codify and consolidate all laws of the state relating to the assessment and collection of taxes; also for all claims arising out of or in any way appertaining to the case set forth in memorial No. 62, assembly of 1872, and stipulating and agreeing that the above sum is in full payment of all demands, of whatever name or nature, growing out of said claim.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in tull force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 131.

[Published April 3, 1872.]

AN ACT to amend sections thirty-five and thirty-six of chapter seventy of the revised statutes, entitled "the incorporation of villages."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section thirty-five of chapter seventy Amended. of the revised statutes is hereby amended so as to read as follows: "Whenever two-thirds of all the owners May make ap of real estate bounding both sides of any street, or plication for 12—Gen. Laws.
